ISCARSAH Webinar - Heritage in Time of Armed Conflict

For time immemorial, armed conflict has been a plague on built heritage. Just in the last century, city centers in Europe and Asia have been decimated, archaeological sites have been intentionally damaged, and places of worship have been lost forever. The [International Scientific Committee on the Analysis and Restoration of Structures of Architectural Heritage \(ISCARSAH\)](#) hosts a webinar presenting perspectives from heritage professionals in Ukraine and Gaza, who are involved in the conservation, protection, salvage, and future reconstruction of historic sites damaged by continuing armed conflict. A third speaker will offer a reflective account of Italian recovery from the damages of World War II. The webinar will be followed by a Q & A session. 
